### Key issues webpages (thematic information research)

The Sustainable Food Cities website has a dedicated space to help you find out who is doing what and what resources are available under the 6 key issues. These are then broken down into 8 examples of actions you may be working on.

1. Promoting healthy and sustainable food to the public
2. Tackling food poverty, diet-related ill health and access to affordable healthy food
3. Building community food knowledge, skills, resources and projects
4. Promoting a vibrant and diverse sustainable food economy
5. Transforming catering and food procurement
6. Reducing waste and the ecological footprint of the food system

The city initiatives are not limited to what Network members are doing but highlight innovative work taking place across the UK. Food Cardiff piloted '[Food and Fun](#)', a school holiday enrichment programme providing nutritious food and fun activities for children during the holidays.
